Match background

Sevilla and Chelsea meet in Andalusia with qualification for the round of 16 already secured and first place in Group E the next aim.

- The teams, who shared a goalless draw at Stamford Bridge on Matchday 1, are level on ten points and both sealed progress to the knockout phase with added-time winners that secured 2-1 away victories last time out. Chelsea substitute Olivier Giroud struck in the 91st minute to snatch all three points at Rennes; Sevilla left it even later at Krasnodar, Munir pouncing five minutes into stoppage time to ensure they would join their English rivals in the last 16.
- Should there be a winner on Matchday 5, they would also clinch first place in the section; a draw would delay the outcome until the final round of games.

Form guide

Sevilla

- The Spanish side opened Group E with that goalless draw at Chelsea before home wins against Rennes (1-0) and Krasnodar (3-2) and the success in Russia last time out.
- This is Sevilla's sixth UEFA Champions League group stage campaign, and a first since 2017/18, when they reached the quarter-finals. They have now qualified for the knockout phase in all but one of their participations.
- Julen Lopetegui's side won the UEFA Europa League in 2019/20, beating Internazionale 3-2 in the final. It was the club's record-extending sixth triumph in the UEFA Cup/UEFA Europa League, all since 2006.
- Sevilla finished first in their UEFA Europa League group last season with 15 points having won all but one of their matches, then ousted CFR Cluj on away goals in the round of 32 (1-1 a, 0-0 h) before wins in one-off ties in Germany against Roma (2-0), Wolverhampton Wanderers (1-0), Manchester United (2-1) and Inter.
- Fourth in Spain in 2019/20, Sevilla won their section in each of their first two UEFA Champions League campaigns and, after finishing third in 2015/16 – when they went on to complete a hat-trick of UEFA Europa League wins – they have been group runners-up in their two most recent seasons in the competition, meaning this is the third successive campaign in which they have reached the round of 16.
- In September, Sevilla lost 2-1 after extra time to European champions Bayern München in the UEFA Super Cup in Budapest. It was their fifth defeat in the match in six appearances.
- The defeat by Bayern was just Sevilla's fifth loss in their last 34 European matches (W24 D5).
- Sevilla have won 19 of their 34 matches in the UEFA Champions League group stage, losing eight.
- The Andalusian side are unbeaten in 14 home European matches (W12 D2), since a 2-1 loss to Bayern in the 2017/18 quarter-final first leg – their last UEFA Champions League fixture at the Ramón Sánchez Pizjuán before Matchday 2.
- Sevilla have won both home UEFA Champions League matches this season having been without a victory in the previous three (D2 L1).
- Sevilla suffered their first, and only, home loss to English visitors when succumbing 3-1 to Manchester City in the 2015/16 UEFA Champions League group stage. They most recently drew 0-0 against Manchester United in the 2017/18 round of 16 (2-1 aggregate). The Andalusian club's record at home to English teams is W4 D2 L1.
- The Matchday 1 draw at Chelsea ended Sevilla's three-match run of victories against Premier League opponents. They have lost only one of their last ten games against English clubs (W5 D4) and remain unbeaten in their last seven (W3 D4).
- Sevilla have fared less well against English opposition in the UEFA Champions League group stage, however, winning one of their seven matches (D3 L3).

Chelsea

- Held at home by Sevilla on Matchday 1, the London club were 4-0 winners at Krasnodar in their next fixture before beating Rennes home (3-0) and away.
- Fourth in the Premier League in 2019/20, this is Chelsea's 17th venture into the UEFA Champions League group stage and a third in four years. The exception came in 2018/19, when they won the UEFA Europa League under Maurizio Sarri.
- Chelsea's last four UEFA Champions League campaigns have all ended in the round of 16. In 2019/20 they were heavily beaten home (0-3) and away (1-4) by eventual champions Bayern München at that stage. The loss in Munich is the London club's only defeat in 13 European away matches (W9 D3).
- Last season Frank Lampard's side recovered from a Matchday 1 defeat at home to Valencia (0-1) to progress as

Group H runners-up with 11 points, finishing behind the Spanish side on head-to-head record.

- Despite their three victories this season, the Blues have won only four of their last nine UEFA Champions League matches (D3 L2).
- European champions in 2012 having been runners-up four years earlier, Chelsea have now reached the round of 16 on 15 occasions.
- The London side have won their UEFA Champions League group 11 times, although they have been runners-up in their section on each of their last two participations.
- Last season's home loss to Valencia was only the Blues' fourth defeat in their last 25 matches against Spanish opponents, home and away (W7 D14). They drew 2-2 at Valencia last season, making it one defeat in their last 12 matches away to Liga clubs (W3 D8).
- However, a 2-1 victory at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 2 in 2017/18 is Chelsea's only success in their last 11 fixtures against Liga clubs, home and away (D6 L4).

Latest news

Sevilla

- Sevilla's first game of the season was that extra-time defeat by Bayern München in the UEFA Super Cup on 24 September.
- Julen Lopetegui's side ended a three-match losing Liga run with a 1-0 home win against Osasuna on 7 November.
- Sevilla had only one victory in six games in all competitions (D2 L3) before Matchday 3, but have now won their last five fixtures, including Saturday's 1-0 Liga success at Huesca.
- Youssef En-Nesyri scored a late winner at the weekend and has now scored five goals in his last six Sevilla games in all competitions, as many as in his previous 26 matches.
- The 1-0 loss to Eibar on 24 October was Sevilla's first home defeat in all competitions since a 2-1 reverse against Villarreal on 15 December 2019, ending a 14-match unbeaten run at the Ramón Sánchez Pizjuán (W8 D6).
- A 1-0 defeat at Granada on 17 October ended Sevilla's 18-match unbeaten Liga run (W10 D8), and was their first loss since a 2-1 reverse at Celta Vigo on 9 February.
- Nemanja Gudelj played all 120 minutes as Serbia lost on penalties to Scotland in their UEFA EURO 2020 play-off final on 12 November, converting a spot kick in his side's 5-4 shoot-out defeat after a 1-1 draw in Belgrade.
- En-Nesyri scored in Morocco's 2-0 win against the Central African Republic in 2021 CAF Africa Cup of Nations qualifying on 17 November.
- Summer signing Oussama Idrissi made his Sevilla debut as a late substitute in a 4-2 home Liga win against Celta on 21 November having recovered from injury.
- Marcos Acuña had to be replaced shortly before half-time against Osasuna on 7 November due to a hamstring problem. He started against Celta but was replaced by Sergio Escudero in the first half and has not played since.
- Yassine Bounou (out since 17 November, illness), Suso (unspecified), Sergio Escudero (elbow) and Carlos Fernández (illness) all missed the weekend win.

Chelsea

- Chelsea are unbeaten in 14 games in all competitions (W8 D6); they had won six successive matches before Sunday's goalless draw at home to Tottenham.
- The London club scored 18 goals in those six victories, conceding only two.
- Chelsea have won nine of their 16 fixtures in all competitions this season, losing only one – 2-0 at home to champions Liverpool in the Premier League on 20 September.
- Having managed Chelsea for 62 matches without a goalless draw, Frank Lampard oversaw two scoreless matches in succession – against Sevilla on Matchday 1 and at Manchester United in the Premier League. Sunday's draw with Spurs made it three stalemates in Chelsea's last nine fixtures.
- The Blues have scored 22 goals in their ten Premier League matches in 2020/21, and have managed three or more in nine of their last 16 league fixtures.
- Edouard Mendy kept clean sheets on his first three Premier League appearances for Chelsea, the first goalkeeper to do so since Petr Čech in 2004. He has kept eight clean sheets in his 11 Blues outings, David McGoldrick's ninth-minute goal for Sheffield United in Chelsea's 4-1 home win on 7 November ending his run of 556 minutes without conceding.
- Olivier Giroud is now seven goals behind France's record scorer Thierry Henry having taken his international tally to 44 with a double in France's 4-2 win at home to Sweden on 17 November, three days after club colleague N'Golo Kanté's goal secured a 1-0 win away to Portugal that booked the world champions' place at next year's UEFA Nations League Finals.
- Timo Werner scored twice, taking his tally to 15 international goals, as Germany defeated Ukraine 3-1 in the UEFA Nations League on 14 November at his former home ground in Leipzig.
- Jorginho's penalty helped Italy to a 2-0 UEFA Nations League win at home to Poland on 15 November; three days later, Jorginho and Emerson, who had also played 90 minutes against Poland, were in the team that won 2-0 in Bosnia and Herzegovina to book a Finals place.
- On 17 November, Mateo Kovačić scored his second and third international goals – and his first since June 2015 – as Croatia lost 3-2 at home to Portugal in the UEFA Nations League.
- On 13 November, Hakim Ziyech got two goals in Morocco's 4-1 CAF Africa Cup of Nations win against the Central African Republic and also opened the scoring in the subsequent 2-0 victory away to the same opponents four days later.
- Mason Mount scored England's second goal in a 4-0 UEFA Nations League win at home to Iceland on 18 November.
- Callum Hudson-Odoi was on target against both Andorra (3-1) and Albania (5-0) in qualifying for the 2021 UEFA European Under-21 Championship.
- Billy Gilmour, who had been sidelined by a knee injury since 9 July, returned as a substitute in Scotland's 2-2 draw at home to Croatia in 2021 UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifying on 12 November, although he was sent off eight minutes after his introduction.
- Christian Puljić came on as a late substitute in the 4-0 home win against Crystal Palace on 3 October, his first appearance since suffering a hamstring injury in the FA Cup final defeat by Arsenal on 1 August. The American went on to make five appearances, including Chelsea's first two Group E games, but then suffered another hamstring injury in the warm-up ahead of the 3-0 win at Burnley on 31 October. He returned as a second-half substitute on Sunday.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, five more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16) and Barcelona (2017/18) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Anderlecht hold the unwanted record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 12 in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), in 2002/03 Lokomotiv Moskva (first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (second group stage), Rangers and Werder Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).
- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia

Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Thirteen more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Josip Iličić for Atalanta in the 2019/20 round of 16 second leg against Valencia. He was the third player to score four in a game that season, all away from home, after group stage quadruples from Bayern's Serge Gnabry (Matchday 2 at Tottenham) and Robert Lewandowski (Matchday 5 at Crvena zvezda).
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
