Match background

After opening Group H wins, Juventus and Chelsea meet in Turin knowing three more points would represent a significant step towards the round of 16.

- While Romelu Lukaku's second-half goal got Chelsea's UEFA Champions League defence off to a winning start at home against Zenit, Juve were 3-0 winners away to Swedish side Malmö.

Previous meetings

- The sides last met in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League group stage, when Juve took four points off Chelsea to play a crucial role in the London club becoming the first – and so far only – holders to not survive the group stage of the following season's competition.
- The Matchday 1 game at Stamford Bridge ended 2-2, Oscar giving Chelsea a two-goal cushion (31, 33) before Arturo Vidal (38) and Fabio Quagliarella (80) rescued a point for Juve.
- Quagliarella (38) and Vidal (61) were also on target in a 3-0 Juventus win in Turin on Matchday 5, Sebastian Giovinco (90+1) rounding off a win that prompted the departure of Blues manager Roberto Di Matteo and all but eliminated Chelsea from the competition – although, under Rafael Benítez, they did go on to win the UEFA Europa League.
- Chelsea had come out on top when the teams were paired in the 2008/09 round of 16, Didier Drogba scoring the only goal of the first leg at Stamford Bridge. The Ivorian also scored the crucial second equaliser in the second leg in Turin, a game in which Juventus twice led through Vincenzo Iaquinta (19) and Alessandro Del Piero (74pen) either side of Michael Essien's equaliser in first-half added time.

Form guide

Juventus

- A team coached by Andrea Pirlo won five of their six games in last season's group stage, snatching first place in Group G with a 3-0 victory at Barcelona on Matchday 6.
- For the second season running, however, Juventus bowed out on away goals in the round of 16, losing on aggregate to Porto (1-2 a, 3-2 h aet) having suffered the same fate against Lyon in 2019/20 (0-1 a, 2-1 h).
- Juventus have lost only five of their 46 European matches at the Juventus Stadium (W29 D12), although four of those defeats have come in their last 14.
- Juve's record run of nine successive Serie A titles was ended by Inter in 2020/21.
- Pirlo was replaced as Juventus coach in the summer, Massimiliano Allegri returning to the club he led to the 2015 and 2017 UEFA Champions League finals during his previous spell in charge between 2014 and 2019.
- Juventus last faced English opposition in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League group stage, winning 1-0 at Manchester United before a 2-1 home defeat.
- That defeat by United ended Juve's nine-match (W5 D4) unbeaten run against Premier League clubs, with five wins in their last seven. It was also their first home defeat against English opponents since a 3-0 loss to United in the 2002/03 UEFA Champions League second group stage; their record between those two losses was W3 D5.

Chelsea

- Chelsea claimed their second UEFA Champions League title in 2020/21 by beating Manchester City 1-0 in the all-English final at Porto's Estádio do Dragão on 29 May, Kai Havertz scoring the only goal in the first half – his first strike in the competition.
- The Blues had made smooth progress through their section (W4 D2) to finish ahead of Sevilla, Krasnodar and Rennes.
- With Thomas Tuchel having replaced Frank Lampard as head coach in January, Chelsea then eased past Atlético de Madrid in the round of 16, winning 1-0 in Bucharest before a 2-0 home victory, and held off Porto in the last eight (2-0 a, 0-1 h) with both matches played in Seville. Chelsea then got the better of Real Madrid in the semi-finals (1-1 a, 2-0 h) before claiming their second UEFA Champions League title against City.
- The Matchday 1 defeat of Zenit made it 13 wins in Chelsea's last 21 UEFA Champions League matches (D5 L3).
- A 4-1 loss at eventual champions Bayern München in the 2019/20 round of 16 second leg is Chelsea's only reverse in their last 17 away European games (W12 D4).
- Edouard Mendy kept nine clean sheets in 12 UEFA Champions League matches last season, the most in a campaign by a goalkeeper for an English side in the competition's history. He added another on Matchday 1 this term.
- Fourth in the Premier League in 2020/21 for the second campaign in a row, Chelsea are participating in their 18th

UEFA Champions League campaign, and a fourth in five years. The exception came in 2018/19, when they won the UEFA Europa League under Maurizio Sarri.

- Tuchel's team have already claimed European silverware this season, beating Villarreal 6-5 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the UEFA Super Cup in Belfast on 11 August. It was their first victory in the competition since 1998; they had lost in 2012, 2013 and 2019.

- The Blues' last games against Italian opponents came in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League group stage, when they drew 3-3 at home to Roma before a 3-0 away loss that made it four games without a win against Serie A sides (D2 L2).

- Chelsea's record away to Serie A sides is W1 D3 L6. They have lost on their last four trips, with the sole win a 4-0 success at Lazio in the 2003/04 group stage.

- A 4-1 extra-time success against Napoli in the round of 16 second leg in their victorious 2011/12 UEFA Champions League campaign is Chelsea's only win in their last nine games against Italian opponents, home and away (D3 L5).

- Jorginho played in all seven games as Italy won UEFA EURO 2020 this summer.

- Bonucci, Chiellini, Locatelli, Chiesa and Bernardeschi also played for Italy, who defeated Mason Mount's England on spot kicks in the final at Wembley. Bonucci scored for Italy in the 1-1 draw and in the penalty shoot-out, when Bernardeschi also found the net.

- Chiesa scored in the 1-1 semi-final draw against César Azpilicueta's Spain. Locatelli missed a penalty in the shoot-out but Bonucci and Bernardeschi both scored as Italy prevailed, Jorginho converting the winning kick.

- Adrien Rabiot and Paulo Dybala have both made 49 appearances in both the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, and UEFA club competition.
- On 22 September Juventus won their first Serie A game of the season at the fifth attempt, beating Spezia 3-2 away thanks to goals from Moise Kean, Federico Chiesa and Matthijs de Ligt.
- That was the first time Juve had scored three goals in a Serie A match since their last victory, a 4-1 win at Bologna on 23 May.
- Juve also scored three goals on Sunday, beating Sampdoria 3-2 in Turin, Manuel Locatelli getting the winner with his first goal for the club. Leonardo Bonucci scored his first Juve goal since 5 December 2020 – although he did find the net for Italy in the UEFA EURO 2020 final – with his first ever Serie A penalty.
- The match was a 400th in Serie A for Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri.
- The Bianconeri had begun the season with two draws and two defeats, their worst start since 1961/62. It was only the third time Juve had failed to win any of their first four Serie A games, after 1942/43, 1955/56 and 1961/62.
- Juventus had been held 1-1 at home by AC Milan on 19 September despite taking an early lead through Álvaro Morata.
- Juve have already dropped seven points from winning positions this season, just three less than in the whole of 2020/21.
- Allegri's side led 1-0 at Spezia but had to come back after going 2-1 down, Chiesa and De Ligt scoring in the final 25 minutes.
- Without a clean sheet in Serie A this term, this is only the second time in 60 years that Juve have conceded ten goals or more after six games. They let in 11 in 1955/56.
- Juve have not kept a clean sheet in 20 Serie A matches, one short of the club record set in 1955.
- Dybala and Morata both had to be substituted against Sampdoria at the weekend due to injury.
- Chiesa was replaced in the final minutes of the game against Spezia having reportedly suffered a thigh injury but started on Sunday.
- Arthur has not played this season after undergoing leg surgery in the summer.

- Andreas Christensen's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Chelsea's unbeaten start to this season's Premier League (W4 D1) was ended by a 1-0 home loss against champions Manchester City on Saturday.
- City's winner was only the second goal the Blues have conceded in the league this season, and the first from open play; they have scored 12 themselves.
- A 3-0 success at home to Aston Villa on 11 September was Chelsea's 600th Premier League win; they made it 601 by beating Tottenham 3-0 away on 19 September. Only Manchester United (691) have more.
- Thiago Silva, N'Golo Kanté and Antonio Rüdiger all scored their first goals of the season at Tottenham; indeed, it

was Kanté's first for the club since 23 November 2019.

- Chelsea's 12 league goals this season have been scored by ten different players; only Romelu Lukaku, with three, has more than one.
- Chelsea beat Villa on penalties in the English League Cup third round on 22 September, Timo Werner scoring the Blues' goal in a 1-1 draw. Thomas Tuchel's side prevailed 4-3 in the shoot-out, Reece James converting the decisive kick.
- The London club will be at home to Southampton in the last 16 in the week beginning 25 October.
- Kanté was out between 28 August and 19 September with an ankle injury.
- Mason Mount missed the City game with a knock while Edouard Mendy returned having not played since Matchday 1 due to a rib injury.
- James was taken off in the first half on Saturday with an ankle problem.
- Christian Puljić has been sidelined since 8 September due to an ankle injury picked up on international duty.
- On 26 August, Jorginho was named UEFA Men's Player of the Year. Mendy was named Goalkeeper of the Season while Kanté collected the award for the best midfielder and Tuchel won the coach's prize.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, four more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16), Barcelona (2017/18) and Manchester City (2020/21) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Marseille hold the record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 13 in a row between March 2012 and November 2020. The 2-0 loss at home to Porto on Matchday 4 of the 2020/21 competition surpassed Anderlecht's previous competition record of 12 losses in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), Lokomotiv Moskva (2002/03, first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (2002/03, second group stage), Rangers and Werder

Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).

- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fifteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Sébastien Haller for Ajax at Sporting CP on Matchday 1 in 2021/22. That was the fifth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20 and Olivier Giroud did likewise for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.

- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.

- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
