## Match background

---

Despite losing at home to FC Basel 1893 on matchday one, Chelsea FC travel to Switzerland knowing a draw will be sufficient to book their place in the knockout rounds.

- Although Oscar gave Chelsea the half-time lead at Stamford Bridge, two late goals from Mohamed Salah and Marco Streller provided a flying start to the group campaign for the visitors. It was the first time Basel had won in England and Chelsea's first reverse in 30 home group matches in the competition.
- The Swiss champions then lost at home to FC Schalke 04 before a 1-1 draw at FC Steaua București, the return three weeks ago ending the same way after Giovanni Sio's equaliser in added time. It left Basel in third place on five points, one behind Schalke.
- On matchday two José Mourinho's team won 4-0 in Bucharest and followed that with two 3-0 victories against Schalke to go three points clear in first place, meaning a fourth consecutive win in Basel will make sure of top spot with a game to spare. Indeed, should Schalke fail to beat Steaua in Bucharest, a point would suffice.

### Previous meetings

- The teams met in last season's UEFA Europa League semi-final, the first competitive encounter between the sides. In the first leg in Switzerland, David Luiz's stoppage-time free-kick earned Chelsea a 2-1 advantage after Fabian Schär's late penalty had cancelled out Victor Moses' first-half opener.
- In the return Chelsea scored three goals in ten second-half minutes, through Fernando Torres, Moses and Luiz again, after Salah had brought Basel level on aggregate on the stroke of half-time. Basel were thus denied becoming the first Swiss side to make it to the final of a major UEFA club tournament.

- Basel have lost four of their ten home fixtures against English opposition with three wins and three draws. Their only victory in their last four home games was a significant one – the 2-1 success over Manchester United FC on matchday six of the 2011/12 UEFA Champions League enabling them to qualify for the knockout rounds at their opponents' expense.
- Basel eliminated Tottenham Hotspur FC in last season's UEFA Europa League quarter-finals, prevailing 4-1 on spot kicks after two 2-2 draws. Their record against English teams overall reads W4 D7 L10.
- In their only previous Swiss assignment, Chelsea lost to FC St Gallen in the first round of the 2000/01 UEFA Cup. They went down 2-0 in Zurich, when John Terry was an unused substitute, after winning the home leg 1-0.

### Match background

- Apart from the win over Manchester United two years ago, Basel also beat FC Oțelul Galați 2-1 at home and lost 2-0 against SL Benfica. In the round of 16 they beat FC Bayern München 1-0 at home but succumbed 7-0 away.
- This season they won both home games in qualifying for a fifth group stage campaign, 1-0 against Maccabi Tel-Aviv FC (4-3 on aggregate) and 2-0 over PFC Ludogorets Razgrad (6-2 on aggregate).
- After defeating Basel last season, Chelsea went on to beat Benfica 2-1 in the UEFA Europa League final in Amsterdam thanks to Branislav Ivanović's header in the last minute of added time. Torres had fired Rafael Benítez's side ahead on the hour with Óscar Cardozo equalising from the spot.
- With their win in the 2011/12 UEFA Champions League, Chelsea thus became the first side to win UEFA's two top club competitions in reverse order in successive seasons. They also became only the fourth side to win all three of UEFA's major club competitions having also won the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup in 1970/71 and 1997/98.
- The Blues have finished as group winners in seven of their last ten campaigns, qualifying for the knockout rounds as runners-up in two of the other years. Last year, however, they became the first UEFA Champions League holders to have their title defence ended in the group stage, losing at FC Shakhtar Donetsk and Juventus after a 4-0 victory at FC Nordsjælland.
- Mourinho has lifted the UEFA Champions League with both FC Porto (2004) and FC Internazionale Milano (2010) and is bidding to become the first manager to win the European Cup with three different teams. Only Bob Paisley (Liverpool FC 1977, 1978, 1981) has won the trophy three times as a coach.

### Team ties

- Philipp Degen played alongside Torres at Liverpool FC between 2008 and 2011 but never appeared against

## Chelsea.

- Basel coach Murat Yakin lost 3-0 with Switzerland against England in a UEFA EURO 2004 group fixture in Coimbra on 17 June. Frank Lampard, Ashley Cole and Terry featured on the other side.
- David Degen and Matías Delgado scored past Mark Schwarzer in Basel's 2-0 victory over Middlesbrough FC in the UEFA Cup quarter-final first leg on 30 March 2006; the Swiss side lost the return 4-1.
- On 19 May 2010 Eden Hazard missed a penalty in Belgium's 2-1 friendly win over Ivan Ivanov's Bulgaria.
- Ivanov and Bulgaria lost 1-0 to Petr Čech's Czech Republic in a 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifier in Sofia on 15 October.

### Basel

#### UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Basel's record of never winning a game on matchday four of the UEFA Champions League continued last time out. They have won three out of four previous outings on matchday five.
- The 2-1 matchday one success at Chelsea was the club's first win on English soil at the tenth attempt, ending their hosts' unbeaten home run in the competition that stretched back to 2003.
- Fabian Schär is a booking away from a suspension after picking up two yellow cards.

#### General information

- Stephan Andrist scored his first goal for the club as Basel came from behind to beat FC Thun 4-1 on Saturday.
- Fabian Frei is the only ever-present in the Basel starting XI in the league and UEFA Champions League this term after Yann Sommer missed Saturday's win. In the goalkeeper's absence Germano Vailati, who joined in June 2012, made his league debut for the club.
- Basel are unbeaten on their travels this season, a run of 15 games. Both their defeats have come at home.
- Marcelo Díaz is likely to miss the rest of the group stage with a broken rib. He is thought to have suffered the problem in Chile's 2-0 win against England, aggravating it during the 2-1 defeat by Brazil four days later. Behrang Safari suffered a thigh injury on matchday three and could miss the rest of the group stage.
- Basel have had two players sent off this season, both in wins against FC Lausanne-Sport. Valentin Stocker was dismissed in a 2-0 victory on 27 July and Giovanni Sio saw red in a 2-1 away triumph on 6 October.

#### International duty

- Five players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Stocker, Sommer, Schär (Switzerland), Díaz (Chile), Giovanni Sio (Ivory Coast).
- Sio was a substitute as Ivory Coast clinched a FIFA World Cup spot, a 1-1 draw in Senegal sealing a 4-2 aggregate win.

### Chelsea

#### UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Chelsea were 29 home group stage games unbeaten prior to their 2-1 loss to Basel on matchday one.
- The Blues have drawn 49 games in UEFA competition, winning 100.

#### General information

- Chelsea's haul of five points from their opening five away matches in the league this season was their worst return since 2000/01 but they made it eight from six on Saturday with a 3-0 win at West Ham United FC. Frank Lampard struck twice against his former side to end a run of ten league games without a goal – his worst spell in a decade.
- Fernando Torres, who has scored two league goals in 2013, missed Saturday's win with an adductor problem while Ashley Cole was left on the bench after a recurrence of his rib injury.
- Marco van Ginkel is expected to be out until March after suffering knee ligament damage against Swindon Town FC on 24 September.
- Eden Hazard has been nominated for the 2014 FIFA Ballon d'Or, which will be announced on 13 January. Mourinho is on the shortlist for the FIFA World Coach of the Year for Men's Football award.

#### International duty

- Chelsea had 16 players called up for their national teams during the international break: Frank Lampard, Ashley Cole, Gary Cahill (England), André Schürrle (Germany), Kevin De Bruyne, Hazard (Belgium), Petr Čech (Czech Republic), Branislav Ivanović (Serbia), Juan Mata (Spain), Oscar, David Luiz, Ramires, Willian (Brazil), John Obi Mikel (Nigeria), Samuel Eto'o (Cameroon), Michael Essien (Ghana).
- Mikel, Eto'o and Essien helped their countries make it to the 2014 FIFA World Cup after play-off victories.
- Lampard received a commemorative cap ahead of England's friendly with Chile on 15 November from his father Frank Lampard Snr to mark his century of international appearances. His daughters were mascots for the 2-0 loss.

## Head coach

### FC Basel 1893: Murat Yakin

---

**Date of birth:** 15 September 1974

**Nationality:** Swiss

**Playing career:** Grasshopper Club, VfB Stuttgart, Fenerbahçe SK, FC Basel 1893 (twice), 1. FC Kaiserslautern

**Coaching career:** FC Concordia Basel, FC Thun, FC Luzern, FC Basel 1893

- The older brother of fellow former Swiss international Hakan Yakin, Basel-born Murat was capped 49 times as a defender and midfielder.
- Won consecutive championships in a five-season spell with Grasshoppers at the beginning of his career. A campaign in Germany with Stuttgart, with whom he was a runner-up in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup final against Chelsea FC, followed before he spent just over a season with Fenerbahçe.
- Of Turkish descent, Yakin returned to Switzerland and Basel during 1999/2000, but was soon off to Kaiserslautern. Re-joined Basel permanently and gained the adoration of the northern club's support, registering seven goals in 32 games during the double-winning 2001/02 season and featuring in Basel's spectacular UEFA Champions League run the next term.
- Made his international debut against the United Arab Emirates in September 1994 but was overlooked for EURO '96 and further disappointments followed as Switzerland failed to qualify for the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cups, as well as UEFA EURO 2000. However, he played all 270 minutes of the Nati's UEFA EURO 2004 campaign in Portugal.
- Retired in 2006 and quickly moved into coaching with Concordia Basel. Rejoined Grasshoppers in 2007 for a two-year stint as assistant coach before returning to front-line management with Thun, whom he led to promotion from the second tier at the first attempt. Took charge at Luzern in 2011, securing runners-up finishes in the league and Swiss Cup, before becoming Basel coach in October 2012 and ending his first season with the Swiss title.

### Chelsea FC: José Mourinho

---

**Date of birth:** 26 January 1963

**Nationality:** Portuguese

**Coaching career:** SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC (twice), FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Joined Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European crown since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals, equalling Sir Alex Ferguson's record of seven last-four appearances, before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Ten players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Zlatan Ibrahimović for Paris Saint-Germain on matchday three this season.
- Cristiano Ronaldo (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) hold the record for the most goals scored in a group stage with eight.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona and FC Bayern München jointly hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003 and from 2 April 2013 respectively; Bayern's run is ongoing. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months

later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
