Match background

Chelsea FC suffered a second Group E defeat against FC Basel 1893 on matchday five but nevertheless take on FC Steaua Bucureşti knowing a win will ensure they progress as section winners.

- Should Chelsea lose they will finish second while a draw would leave them top as long as Basel do not win at FC Schalke 04.
- In the 1 October meeting between the sides, Chelsea were 4-0 winners with Ramires scoring twice. Daniel Georgievski's own goal and Frank Lampard completed the scoring.
- Chelsea were beaten 2-1 by Basel at Stamford Bridge on matchday one, but two 3-0 victories against Schalke have given them a one-point lead over Basel at the summit, with the German club a further point behind.
- Steaua will finish bottom of the section regardless of the matchday six results. They lost 3-0 at Schalke in their first game and in their second away fixture they drew 1-1 in Basel, a third successive Group E draw following in matchday five's stalemate against Schalke.
- The Romanian club have not won for 22 games in the UEFA Champions League proper, since a 4-1 success at FC Dynamo Kyiv on 13 September 2006. Steaua's failure to beat Schalke on matchday five equalled the longest UEFA Champions League run without a win, set by FC Spartak Moskva between 5 December 2000 and 22 November 2006.

Previous meetings

- The teams were drawn together in last season's UEFA Europa League round of 16 when Chelsea needed to retrieve a 1-0 deficit from the away leg following Raul Rusescu's first-half penalty. At Stamford Bridge Juan Mata (34) levelled the overall scores and, though Vlad Chiricheş (45) restored Steaua's aggregate advantage, John Terry (58) and Fernando Torres (71) struck to take Chelsea through.
- The teams in London on 14 March 2013 were:

- Chelsea's only previous encounters with Romanian opposition came in the 2008/09 UEFA Champions League group stage, where they beat CFR 1907 Cluj 2-1 at home after a 0-0 draw away. Petr Čech, Terry, John Obi Mikel, Frank Lampard and Ashley Cole played in those games while Branislav Ivanović was on the bench both times.
- Steaua's 17 matches against English clubs have ended W5 D4 L8 (W0 D2 L6 away).
- Steaua's most successful recent European campaign ended in England in dramatic circumstances. Leading 1-0 from the first leg of their 2005/06 UEFA Cup semi-final against Middlesbrough FC, and 3-0 up overall after 24 minutes of the return, they were heading through on away goals until Massimo Maccarone struck after 89 minutes at the Riverside Stadium to secure a 4-2 home win and a 4-3 aggregate success for the English side, who had Mark Schwarzer in goal.

Match background

- Chelsea have finished as winners of their group in seven of their last ten campaigns and qualified for the knockout rounds as runners-up in two of the other years.
- Last year, though, they became the first UEFA Champions League holders to have their title defence ended in the group stage despite taking seven points from their three home matches. They then went on to beat SL Benfica 2-1 in the UEFA Europa League final in Amsterdam thanks to Ivanović's last-gasp header.
- Chelsea thus became the first side to win UEFA's two top club competitions in reverse order in successive seasons. They also became only the fourth side to win all three of UEFA's major club competitions.
- Mourinho, who has lifted the UEFA Champions League with both FC Porto (2004) and FC Internazionale Milano (2010), is bidding to become the first manager to win the European Cup with three different teams. Only Bob Paisley (Liverpool FC 1977, 1978, 1981) has won the trophy three times as a coach.
- Steaua are the only Romanian club to have triumphed in Europe, winning the European Champion Clubs' Cup in 1985/86 by defeating FC Barcelona in a penalty shoot-out.
- In their first participation in the group stage since 2008/09, the Bucharest club have won just four of their 41 group matches over seven campaigns.
- Their away form served Laurenţiu Reghecampf's team well in this season's qualifying rounds, winning at FK Vardar and FC Dinamo Tbilisi before a 2-2 draw at Legia Warszawa in the play-offs.

Team ties

- Reghecampf played both legs of Steaua's 1997/98 UEFA Cup third round against Aston Villa FC, who lost 2-1 in the Romanian capital before overturning the deficit 2-0 at home.
- In Reghecampf's last season before moving to Germany, Steaua eliminated Lampard's West Ham United FC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup second round, winning 2-0 at home before a 0-0 away draw.
- Although he had not faced Romanian opposition before this season, Mourinho worked with Romanian players at Barcelona (Gheorghe Popescu), in his first spell at Stamford Bridge (Adrian Mutu), and at Inter (Cristian Chivu).
- Cristian Tănase scored in Romania's 3-2 win against an Australia team containing Schwarzer in Malaga on 6 February 2013. Mihai Doru Pintilii and Alexandru Bourceanu were also in the Romanian side for what was the first ever match between the teams.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Chelsea were 29 home group stage games unbeaten prior to their 2-1 loss to FC Basel 1893 on matchday one.
- Chelsea's next draw will be their 50th in UEFA competition.

General information

- Chelsea conceded a last-minute Oussama Assaidi goal on Saturday as they lost 3-2 at Stoke City FC. Having won 4-3 at Sunderland AFC last Wednesday, when Eden Hazard struck twice, the Blues conceded three or more goals in consecutive Premier League games for the first time since October 1999.
- Samuel Eto'o was a substitute at Stoke after two games out with a groin problem but David Luiz (knee) and Oscar (ankle) missed out with knocks.
- Chelsea have conceded 17 goals in the Premier League this season, already two more than they let in in the whole of José Mourinho's first campaign at Stamford Bridge in 2004/05.
- Demba Ba scored his first Premier League goal since March as Chelsea won 3-1 against Southampton FC three days earlier. That result extended Mourinho's unbeaten league record at Stamford Bridge to 67 games.
- Frank Lampard scored twice in a 3-0 victory against former side West Ham United FC on 23 November to end a run of ten league games without a goal his worst spell in a decade.
- Ashley Cole has not played for the Blues since 2 November, having briefly been sidelined with a rib injury sustained while on England duty.
- Marco van Ginkel is expected to be out until March after suffering knee ligament damage against Swindon Town FC on 24 September.
- Hazard has been nominated for the 2014 FIFA Ballon d'Or, which will be announced on 13 January. Mourinho is on the shortlist for the FIFA World Coach of the Year for Men's Football award.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Of Steaua's UEFA Champions League squad, only Pantelis Kapetanos (with CFR 1907 Cluj) and Ionuţ Neagu (FC Oţelul Galaţi) had played in the group stage before this season.
- Alexandru Bourceanu is serving a one-game ban; Łukasz Szukała and Federico Piovaccari are both a booking away from a suspension.

General information

- Laurenţiu Reghecampf's side won 2-0 at home to Oţelul on Thursday to end a run of five successive draws and book a place in the Romanian Cup semi-finals. It was Steaua's first victory since 30 October.
- · Midfielder Alexandru Târnovan, 18, scored within 19 minutes of coming on for his first-team debut against Otelul.
- Piovaccari also struck to take his tally to ten goals in his last 17 appearances for Steaua in all competitions.
- Mihai Pintilii came on as a substitute against Oţelul on his return from a muscle strain that had kept him out since matchday four.
- Steaua drew 1-1 away to Oţelul in the league on Sunday and are undefeated in the league this season, winning nine and drawing five of their opening 14 fixtures. They have drawn their last four matches 1-1, however, and have not won in the league since 27 October; they have drawn six of their last seven matches in all competitions.
- Lucian Filip suffered a broken leg in training on 19 November and will miss the rest of the group stage.

Head coach

Chelsea FC: José Mourinho

Date of birth: 26 January 1963 Nationality: Portuguese

Coaching career: SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC (twice), FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Joined Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European crown since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals, equalling Sir Alex Ferguson's record of seven last-four appearances, before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.

- A right-back who could also play in midfield, Reghecampf started his career at hometown club Târgovişte before joining Steaua in 1996 aged 21. Stayed four years and won two league titles, one Romanian Cup and one Super Cup, adding a Bulgarian league title during a six-month loan at Litex in 1998/99.
- Moved to Germany in 2000 and spent four years with both Cottbus and Aachen, where he was captain influencing his mentality, approach and later work as a coach. Hung up his boots in 2009 following a season with Kaiserslautern and returned home to start his managerial career with second division Snagov.
- Moved on to Universitatea Craiova for the second half of 2009/10, helping the club avoid relegation; short spells at Gloria Bistriţa and back at both Snagov and Universitatea Craiova followed.
- Took charge of Concordia Chiajna in December 2011 and lifted the club from 17th position to tenth, collecting 34 points from a possible 48 in the second half of the campaign which won him a return to Steaua 12 years after he had left the club.
- In his first season back led Steaua to a first league title in seven years and the Romanian Super Cup; guided the club into the UEFA Europa League round of 16 and took them into the UEFA Champions League group stage at the start of 2013/14.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Ten players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Zlatan Ibrahimović for Paris Saint-Germain on matchday three this season.
- Cristiano Ronaldo and Zlatan Ibrahimović (both 2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) hold the record for the most goals scored in a group stage with eight.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with ten, from 2 April 2013 onwards. Their win at PFC CSKA Moskva on 27 November 2013 surpassed the previous mark of nine, set by Barcelona between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, a mark FC Steaua Bucureşti equalled on matchday five in 2013/14.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- · Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in

Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
