Match background

Chelsea FC's only previous visit to Galatasaray AŞ ended in a 5-0 win and now one of their former heroes will be looking to prevent a repeat when the teams meet in the round of 16 first leg.

- Didier Drogba was part of the Chelsea side that lifted the UEFA Champions League for the first time in 2011/12, scoring a late equaliser and then the decisive penalty in the final shoot-out against FC Bayern München in Munich on 19 May 2012. That was the Ivorian's final kick for the club.
- This season Chelsea made up for their 2012/13 disappointment, when they became the first UEFA Champions League holders to fail to make it through the group stage. That failure was the only blot in 11 otherwise consecutive qualifying campaigns; this season, José Mourinho's side won their group for the eighth time in that span.
- Mourinho masterminded Chelsea's sole round of 16 defeat between 2006/07 and 2011/12, as coach of FC Internazionale Milano in 2009/10.
- Although they reached the second group stage in 2000/01 and again the following year, Galatasaray's only previous experience of the round of 16 came last year when they beat FC Schalke 04 4-3 on aggregate. The home leg ended 1-1, Burak Yılmaz opening the scoring. Hamit Altıntop and Burak were on target in the away game, substitute Umut Bulut firing the winner.

Previous meetings

- Tore André Flo gave Chelsea a two-goal cushion in the UEFA Champions League group stage fixture between the teams 15 years ago by scoring either side of the interval. Further second-half goals arrived from Gianfranco Zola and substitutes Dennis Wise and Gabriele Ambrosetti.

- The game in London on 28 September 1999 had ended 1-0 to Chelsea with Dan Petrescu (52) on target.
- That home defeat was the second suffered by Galatasaray in eight games at home to English opponents. With wins in both their last two encounters – in the group stage against Liverpool FC in 2006/07 (3-2) and Manchester United FC (1-0) last season – their home record is W3 D3 L2. Overall it is W3 D7 L7.
- In 1999/2000 Galatasaray defeated Arsenal FC 4-1 on penalties after the UEFA Cup final in Copenhagen had finished goalless following extra time, becoming the first Turkish team to win a UEFA competition.
- In their last meeting with a Turkish club, Chelsea lost 2-1 at Fenerbahçe SK in the 2007/08 quarter-finals, but won 2-0 at home to progress. They also met Beşiktaş JK in the 2003/04 group stage, losing 2-0 at Stamford Bridge but won by the same scoreline in the away game, at the Arena AufSchalke in Gelsenkirchen, Germany.

Match background

- Galatasaray lost their first game in Group B 6-1 at home to Real Madrid CF, Roberto Mancini subsequently replacing Fatih Terim as coach and overseeing a draw at Juventus in his first game on matchday two. The point would prove crucial as the Turkish side defeated Juve on matchday six through Wesley Sneijder's late goal to finish runners-up in the section.
- In their other home game, Galatasaray beat FC København 3-1 but lost in Copenhagen (0-1) and Madrid (1-4).
- Chelsea, looking to win a European trophy for the third successive year after capturing the UEFA Champions League in 2012 and the UEFA Europa League in 2013, won Group E by a two-point margin from Schalke despite home-and-away defeats against FC Basel 1893. They won all four other fixtures without conceding a goal, beating FC Steaua Bucureşti 4-0 away and 1-0 at home and Schalke 3-0 home and away.
- Mourinho, who has captured the UEFA Champions League with both FC Porto (2004) and FC Internazionale Milano (2010), is bidding to become the first manager to win the European Cup with three different teams. Only Bob Paisley (Liverpool FC 1977, 1978, 1981) has won the trophy three times as a coach.

Team ties

- Drogba was at Chelsea between 2004 and 2012 – playing under Mourinho from June 2004 to September 2007 – and scored 100 goals in 226 league matches. He also won three Premier League titles, four FA Cups and two League Cups.
- Emmanuel Eboué was at Arsenal FC between 2005 and 2011, playing alongside Ashley Cole until 2006.

- Mancini was manager of Manchester City FC from December 2009 to May 2013, leading them to the Premier League title in 2011/12. He also won the 2011 FA Cup with the club.
- Sneijder played under Mourinho at Inter in 2009/10, helping eliminate Chelsea 3-1 on aggregate in the round of 16 on their way to lifting the trophy.
- Altıntop played for Mourinho at Real Madrid CF in 2011/12.
- Felipe Melo and Ramires were in the Brazil squad at the 2009 FIFA Confederations Cup and 2010 FIFA World Cup.

General information

- Nine points behind Süper Lig leaders Fenerbahçe SK at the end of the group stage, Roberto Mancini's side have since cut that deficit and reached the two-legged Turkish Cup semi-finals, where Bursaspor await.
- Galatasaray have lost only one of their last 19 games in all competitions and are 16 matches unbeaten at home (W13 D3). They have won just four of 17 away fixtures all season.
- Cimbom have kept seven clean sheets in their last eight games, going 614 minutes without conceding at one point.
- Galatasaray's haul of 44 points from 22 league games is one better than their tally at the same stage last season when they were top.
- Aydın Yılmaz broke his left ankle in a Turkish Cup match against Elazığspor on 22 January. Gökhan Zan has not played since 22 December because of a hamstring injury, although he is back in training.
- Aurélien Chedjou has missed the last three games with a right groin problem.
- Hamit Altıntop, out since August with a back problem, made his comeback as a substitute in a 0-0 draw with Antalyaspor on 12 February.

- The Blues signed FC Basel 1893's Mohamed Salah – who scored home and away against them in the group stage – while SL Benfica's Nemanja Matić re-joined the club. Both are ineligible for the UEFA Champions League.
- Chelsea paid AS Saint-Étienne a reported €15.1m to acquire 19-year-old defender Kurt Zouma, who will stay with the French team on loan until the end of the season.

General information

- Five points behind leaders Arsenal FC ahead of matchday six, Chelsea are now a point above the Gunners at the top of the Premier League following a 12-match unbeaten run in the league.
- Chelsea have won just six of their last 13 away games in all competitions.
- The Blues won 1-0 at Manchester City FC on 3 February; no other English team has managed even a draw there this season.
- Frank Lampard made his 572nd Premier League appearance in Saturday's 1-0 win against Everton FC, going level with David James in second on the all-time list. Ryan Giggs is first with 630.
- Chelsea have conceded 21 goals in the Premier League this season, already six more than they let in during the whole of José Mourinho's first campaign at Stamford Bridge in 2004/05.
- Eden Hazard scored his second career hat-trick, and first for Chelsea, in a 3-0 win against Newcastle United FC on 8 February. Samuel Eto'o hit three in a 3-1 defeat of Manchester United FC on 19 January.
- Mourinho is 74 games unbeaten in the league at Stamford Bridge.
- Marco van Ginkel is expected to be out until March after suffering knee ligament damage on 24 September.

Head coach

Galatasaray AŞ: Roberto Mancini

Date of birth: 27 November 1964

Nationality: Italian

Playing career: Bologna FC, UC Sampdoria, SS Lazio, Leicester City FC

Coaching career: ACF Fiorentina, SS Lazio, FC Internazionale Milano, Manchester City FC, Galatasaray AŞ

- Spent the majority of his playing career in Italy, winning Serie A titles and UEFA Cup Winners' Cups with both Sampdoria and Lazio as well as six editions of the Coppa Italia, four with Sampdoria and two with Lazio. Capped 36 times by Italy, the forward was a bronze medallist at the 1990 FIFA World Cup.
- Started his coaching career as assistant to Sven-Göran Eriksson at Lazio before replacing Fatih Terim at Fiorentina in 2001. After leading the Viola to the Coppa Italia, he returned to Lazio and repeated that feat as well as steering the Roman club into the UEFA Champions League and to the UEFA Cup semi-finals in 2002/03.
- Became coach of Inter in July 2004, replacing Alberto Zaccheroni one day after terminating his contract with Lazio; led the Nerazzurri to Coppa Italia glory in his debut season, Inter's first domestic honour since the 1989 Scudetto. After Juventus were stripped of their 2005/06 title and AC Milan suffered a points penalty, Inter were finally crowned champions of Italy again. Mancini repeated that success in 2006/07.
- Left Inter in May 2008 despite winning another title and replaced Mark Hughes as manager of Manchester City midway through the 2009/10 Premier League season. City finished fifth in his first campaign, third in his second – when they also lifted the FA Cup – and dramatically won the top flight for the first time in 44 years on the final day of his third.
- City finished second the following season, but Mancini was sacked two days after losing to Wigan Athletic FC in the 2013 FA Cup final. Mancini replaced Terim again that September, signing a three-year deal with Galatasaray.

Chelsea FC: José Mourinho

Date of birth: 26 January 1963

Nationality: Portuguese

Coaching career: SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC (twice), FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Joined Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European crown since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals, equalling Sir Alex Ferguson's record of seven last-four appearances, before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 30 occasions, including FC Barcelona and Málaga CF in last season's round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-three ties have been decided on away goals, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 21 ties have required extra time. Eight have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, three round of 16 encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- Thirteen ties have gone to penalties, including six finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern's 7-0 second-leg defeat of FC Basel 1893 in the 2011/12 round of 16 is the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid CF 1998, FC Bayern München 2013) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- In 2012/13 Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Ten players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Zlatan Ibrahimović for Paris Saint-Germain on matchday three in 2013/14.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
