Match background

José Mourinho's first European game as Chelsea FC manager came against Paris Saint-Germain in 2004 and he faces the same opponents again as he tries to steer the London club through to the UEFA Champions League semi-final in his first season back at Stamford Bridge.

- Mourinho will need no reminding of the threat posed by Zlatan Ibrahimović after the pair worked together at FC Internazionale Milano and the Swedish striker has managed ten goals already this season as Paris aim for only a second semi-final appearance.

Previous meetings

- When the teams met in the 2004/05 group stage, Chelsea were 3-0 victors in Paris through a John Terry header and two strikes from Didier Drogba. It gave Mourinho a winning start in his first UEFA Champions League game in charge of the west London side the season after lifting the trophy for the first time with FC Porto.

- The full lineups at the Parc des Princes on 14 September 2004 were:

- The return game at Stamford Bridge ended goalless.

- The teams also drew 1-1 in a friendly on 23 July 2012 at Yankee Stadium in New York, Nenê and Lucas Piazon scoring the goals. The starting lineups were:

- Paris have played seven matches against English sides with the record W1 D3 L3. Their only victory came in the first leg of the 1996/97 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup semi-final, a 3-0 triumph against Liverpool FC setting up a 3-2 aggregate win. In the final they lost 1-0 to FC Barcelona. Three years earlier, PSG had drawn 1-1 at home to Arsenal FC in the last four of the same competition and went out 2-1 on aggregate.

- The win in Paris is Chelsea's only triumph on French soil. They were last there for a UEFA Champions League group stage fixture in 2010/11, losing 1-0 at Olympique de Marseille. They lost at the same venue and by the same score in the 1999/2000 second group stage and also went down 3-1 at AS Monaco FC in the 2003/04 semi-final first leg, eventually succumbing 5-3 on aggregate.

- Chelsea did beat an FC Girondins de Bordeaux side coached by Laurent Blanc 4-0 in London in the 2008/09 group stage – Frank Lampard with the opening goal – before a 1-1 draw in France.

Match background

- Paris are in the quarter-finals for the second time in successive seasons and only the third time in all. A year ago at this stage they drew 2-2 at home to Barcelona and 1-1 at the Camp Nou, losing on away goals.

- In this season's round of 16 a 4-0 win at Bayer 04 Leverkusen – with two goals from Ibrahimović – set up a comfortable Paris victory. They won the return 2-1 to take their goal tally in the competition to 22, of which Ibrahimović has contributed ten.

- At home in this season's group stage Paris beat SL Benfica (3-0) and Olympiacos CF (2-1) and drew 1-1 with RSC Anderlecht.

- Paris are unbeaten in 28 European home games. The last visiting team to prevail at the Parc des Princes in UEFA competition were Hapoel Tel-Aviv FC, 4-2 winners in the UEFA Cup group stage in November 2006.

- Paris' only other European Cup semi-final appearance came in 1994/95 when they lost 3-0 on aggregate to AC Milan.

- Chelsea are looking to book their place in a seventh semi-final in 11 campaigns. They reached this stage with a 2-0 home win against Galatasaray AŞ, securing a 3-1 aggregate success.

- Chelsea won their group for the eighth time (they have finished second on three occasions). They lost home and away against FC Basel 1893 but won their four other fixtures without conceding a goal, beating FC Steaua Bucureşti 4-0 away and 1-0 at home and FC Schalke 04 3-0 home and away.

- Mourinho, who also captured the UEFA Champions League with Inter (2010), is bidding to become the first manager to win the European Cup with three different teams. Only Bob Paisley (Liverpool FC 1977, 1978, 1981) has won the trophy three times as a coach.

Team ties

- Alex made 135 appearances for Chelsea between 2007 and 2012, scoring ten times. He joined in 2004 but spent three seasons on loan at PSV Eindhoven before returning to Stamford Bridge, earning a UEFA Champions League runners-up medal in 2008. He won the 2009/10 Premier League, when he also helped the club win the FA Cup he had also won in 2009. He signed for Paris in January 2012.
- Other players who have served both clubs include Claude Makelele, Nicolas Anelka and Mateja Kežman.
- In 2010/11 Eden Hazard lifted the French Cup after LOSC Lille's 1-0 win over Paris and then a week later played in a 2-2 draw at Parc des Princes which gave LOSC the French double for the first time since 1946. He lost only one of nine Ligue 1 games against Paris, scoring in a 2-1 home win in April 2012.
- At LOSC Hazard was a team-mate of Yohan Cabaye and Lucas Digne.
- César Azpilicueta played for Marseille between 2010 and 2012, winning only one of his three games against Paris: a 3-0 success in November 2011 in which he helped set up one of the goals.
- Petr Čech played for Stade Rennais FC between 2002 and 2004, winning one of four league games against Paris.
- Demba Ba began his career at FC Rouen and was a team-mate of Cabaye at Newcastle United FC. The Paris midfielder was on Tyneside between 2011 and 2014, scoring 18 goals in 93 appearances and playing in two home wins against Chelsea and one win at Stamford Bridge. He was twice on the losing side against the Blues.
- Zoumana Camara spent 2003/04 on loan at Leeds United AFC from RC Lens, making 15 appearances and scoring once.
- Mourinho signed Thiago Motta for Inter in July 2009 when he became a team-mate of Samuel Eto'o. Ibrahimović had spent 2008/09 working under the Portuguese coach, scoring 25 goals to finish as Serie A's top scorer as Inter won the title.
- Oscar scored in Brazil's 3-0 friendly win over a France side containing Blaise Matuidi and Cabaye on 9 June 2013 in Porto Alegre.
- Thiago Silva, Lucas and Marquinhos are Brazil team-mates of David Luiz, Oscar and Ramires.
- Blanc, who was at Barcelona in 1996/97 when Mourinho was working alongside the club's coach Bobby Robson, finished his playing career at Manchester United FC between 2001 and 2003, featuring in 3-0 wins for both away team in his first season and a 2-2 draw at Stamford Bridge in his second.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Zlatan Ibrahimović scored eight goals in the group stage, equalling a record held by Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), though Cristiano Ronaldo went one better this season.
- Ibrahimović became the tenth player to score four goals in a UEFA Champions League game when Paris won 5-0 at RSC Anderlecht on matchday three – the French club's biggest away triumph in Europe. On matchday five, he became the 18th player to feature 100 times in the UEFA Champions League.
- Only FC Barcelona's Xavi Hernández has attempted and completed (885/818) more passes than Paris midfielder Thiago Motta (780/702) in this season's UEFA Champions League.
- Blaise Matuidi and Adrien Rabiot are both one yellow card away from a suspension.

General information

- Paris have won a club record nine straight games in all competitions, conceding just twice in the process. They won 1-0 at OGC Nice on Friday, their seventh straight Ligue 1 success.
- Ibrahimović has scored 41 goals in his last 36 appearances for club and country.
- Gregory van der Wiel has not played since 8 March because of knee tendonitis.
- Paris will face Olympique Lyonnais in the French League Cup final at the Stade de France on 19 April.

- Branislav Ivanović, John Obi Mikel and Ramires are all a booking away from suspension.

General information

- Chelsea suffered their second loss in their last 17 Premier League fixtures on Saturday, going down 1-0 at Crystal Palace FC. Their other loss in that run was a 1-0 defeat at Aston Villa FC on 15 March.
- Mohamed Salah, not eligible for the UEFA Champions League, scored his first Chelsea goal in a 6-0 defeat of visiting Arsenal FC on 22 March – the Blues' biggest victory under José Mourinho.
- Samuel Eto'o, Eden Hazard and André Schürrle have all scored league hat-tricks in 2014. All of Eto'o's 11 goals in all competitions have come at home.
- Chelsea have conceded 24 goals in the Premier League this season, nine more than they let in during the whole of Mourinho's first campaign at Stamford Bridge in 2004/05.
- Mourinho is 76 games unbeaten in the league at Stamford Bridge.
- Marco van Ginkel, who suffered knee ligament damage in late September, returned to action on 21 March with a 45-minute outing for the club's Under-21 side.
- Ashley Cole has missed the last four games with a knee injury. Eto'o suffered a hamstring injury early on against Arsenal.

Coaching career: FC Girondins de Bordeaux, France, Paris Saint-Germain

- The defender's 20-year club career brought a French Cup win with Montpellier in 1990, a 1996 league and cup double with Auxerre, the 1997 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup with Barcelona and a Premier League title with United just before retirement in 2003.
- Nicknamed Le Président on account of his authority, elegance and leadership. Famous for 'good luck' kiss on goalkeeper Fabien Barthez's bald head before kick-offs, he won the 1998 FIFA World Cup on home soil after scoring France's golden goal winner against Paraguay in the last 16, but missed the Paris final after being sent off in the semi-final.
- Helped France win UEFA EURO 2000, scoring against Denmark in the group stage, before retiring from international football that year with 97 caps and 16 goals.
- Spent four years gaining coaching qualifications before taking charge of Bordeaux in June 2007. His team finished second in his first season and won a championship and League Cup double in 2009. Guided Bordeaux to the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals before succeeding Raymond Domenech as France coach that summer.
- Blanc's France lost their first two games but then went 23 matches unbeaten prior to two losses at UEFA EURO 2012, the second in the quarter-finals against Spain. He subsequently left his post as national coach but returned to management when stepping into Carlo Ancelotti's shoes at Paris in June 2013.

Chelsea FC: José Mourinho

Date of birth: 26 January 1963

Nationality: Portuguese

Coaching career: SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC (twice), FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Joined Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European crown since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals, equalling Sir Alex Ferguson's record of seven last-four appearances, before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 31 occasions, including Manchester United FC in this season's round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-three ties have been decided on away goals, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 21 ties have required extra time. Eight have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, three round of 16 encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- Thirteen ties have gone to penalties, including six finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- Real Madrid CF won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout record for the biggest first-leg lead, Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern's 7-0 second-leg defeat of FC Basel 1893 in the 2011/12 round of 16 is the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match.
- The biggest European Cup quarter-final victory was Real Madrid's 8-0 first-leg defeat of Sevilla FC in 1957/58.
- Manchester United's 7-1 win against AS Roma in 2006/07 is the biggest victory in a UEFA Champions League quarter-final match. Barcelona have twice won 5-1, against Chelsea after extra time (1999/2000) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2010/11), while there have been four 4-0 victories.
- Chelsea-Liverpool FC in 2008/09 featured 12 goals over the two legs, a quarter-final record.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid CF 1998, FC Bayern München 2013) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Ten players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Zlatan Ibrahimović for Paris Saint-Germain on matchday three in 2013/14.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
