Match background

FC Steaua București's first home game in the UEFA Champions League for five years pits them against Chelsea FC, who were beaten at the Arena Națională last season.

- Chelsea went down on matchday one, unexpectedly losing 2-1 to FC Basel 1893 at Stamford Bridge. Steaua were also defeated in their first fixture, going down 3-0 at FC Schalke 04.

Previous meetings

- Last season, Steaua's win came in the UEFA Europa League round of 16 when Raul Rusecu's first-half penalty put the 2012 UEFA Champions League winners on the back foot. Juan Mata levelled the overall scores at Stamford Bridge and, though Vlad Chiricheș restored Steaua's aggregate advantage, John Terry and Fernando Torres struck to take Chelsea through.

- The teams in Bucharest on 7 March 2013 were:

- Chelsea's only previous encounters with Romanian opposition came in the 2008/09 UEFA Champions League group stage, where they drew 0-0 away then won 2-1 at home against CFR 1907 Cluj. Petr Čech, Terry, John Obi Mikel, Frank Lampard and Ashley Cole played in those games while Branislav Ivanović was on the bench both times.

- Steaua's 16 matches against English clubs to date ended W5 D4 L7 (W5 D2 L1 at home).

- Steaua's most successful recent European campaign ended in England in dramatic circumstances. Leading 1-0 from the first leg of their 2005/06 UEFA Cup semi-final tie against Middlesbrough FC, and 3-0 up overall after 24 minutes of the return, they were then heading through on away goals until Massimo Maccarone struck after 89 minutes at the Riverside Stadium to secure a 4-2 home win – and a 4-3 aggregate success – for the English side, who had Mark Schwarzer in goal.

Match background

- Steaua are the only Romanian club to have triumphed in Europe, winning the European Champion Clubs' Cup in 1985/86 by defeating FC Barcelona in a penalty shoot-out.

- In their first participation in the group stage since 2008/09, the Bucharest club have won just four of their 37 group matches over six campaigns, picking up 11 draws. Their last victory came at FC Dynamo Kyiv on 13 September 2006, since when they have recorded 13 defeats and four draws. At home they have not won in three campaigns, a run of ten games, their last success coming against RTS Widzew Łódź 1-0 on 16 October 1996.

- Their away form served Laurențiu Reghecampf's team well in the qualifying rounds, a 2-2 draw at Legia Warszawa taking them through the play-offs on away goals after a 1-1 home draw.

- In the third qualifying round teenager Gabriel Iancu scored twice to earn the Romanian champions a 2-0 win at FC Dinamo Tbilisi, a 1-1 draw at the Arena Națională ensuring their passage. Steaua did beat FK Vardar 3-0 at home in the second qualifying round – their 100th win in UEFA competition – going through 5-1 overall.

- After defeating Steaua, Chelsea went on to beat SL Benfica 2-1 in the UEFA Europa League final in Amsterdam thanks to Ivanović's header in the last minute of added time.

- With their 2011/12 UEFA Champions League triumph, Chelsea became the first side to win UEFA's two top club competitions in reverse order in successive seasons. They also became only the fourth side to collect all three of UEFA's major club competitions – they also lifted the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup in 1970/71 and 1997/98.

- The Blues have an outstanding group stage record, finishing winners of their section in seven of their last ten campaigns and qualifying for the knockout rounds as runners-up in two of the other years. Last year, however, they became the first UEFA Champions League holders to have their title defence ended in the group stage.

- Defeats at FC Shakhtar Donetsk and Juventus left Chelsea in third place in Group E despite a 4-0 victory at FC Nordsjælland.

- José Mourinho, who has lifted the trophy with both FC Porto (2004) and FC Internazionale Milano (2010), is bidding to become the first manager to win the European Cup with three different teams.

Team ties

- Laurențiu Reghecampf came up against two English sides as a Steaua player. In the 1997/98 UEFA Cup third round he played in both legs as Aston Villa FC lost 2-1 in the Romanian capital before overturning the deficit 2-0 at home.

- In Reghecampf's last season before moving to Germany, Steaua eliminated a West Ham United FC side containing Frank Lampard in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup second round, winning 2-0 at home before a 0-0 away draw.
- This will be Mourinho's first fixture with a Romanian team though he worked with Romanian players during his time at FC Barcelona (Gheorghe Popescu), in his first spell at Stamford Bridge (Adrian Mutu), and at FC Internazionale Milano (Cristian Chivu).
- Cristian Tănase scored in a 3-2 win for Romania against an Australian team containing Schwarzer. The friendly, the first ever match between the teams, took place in Malaga on 6 February 2013 with Mihai Doru Pintilii and Alexandru Bourceanu also in the Romania side.

General information

- Steaua are undefeated in the league this season, winning six and drawing one of their opening seven fixtures, scoring 19 goals in the process.
- Laurențiu Reghecampf rested 12 players as Steaua booked a place in the Romanian Cup round of 16 last Thursday with a 4-0 victory over fourth-tier AS Avântul Bârsana. There were five debutants – Neagu, Niță, Florin Mitriță, Varela and Toni Răzvan – as Mihai Răduț and summer signing Kapetanos scored two goals apiece.
- Alexandru Chipciu has not played since having surgery on his tibia on 21 May.
- Steaua's matchday one defeat at FC Schalke 04 ended an 11-match unbeaten run away from home, stretching back to 14 March and the 3-1 defeat at Chelsea in the UEFA Europa League round of 16.
- Steaua won their 24th title in 2012/13, their first in seven years, by a record 16-point margin. They added a sixth Romanian Super Cup (also a record) by beating cup holders Petrolul Ploiești 3-0 on 10 July.

General information

- John Terry scored his first goal of the campaign as Chelsea, who had Fernando Torres sent off (81), recovered to draw 1-1 at Tottenham Hotspur FC. Terry has registered in each of the last 14 Premier League seasons.
- Chelsea have 11 points from six games this season, as they had in September 2007 when José Mourinho's first spell at Stamford Bridge ended.
- Chelsea ended 2012/13 a season-best ten games unbeaten and extended that sequence to 14 this term (the shoot-out loss in the UEFA Super Cup is counted as a draw) before back-to-back defeats by Everton FC and FC Basel 1893. They returned to winning ways with a 2-0 derby victory over Fulham before beating Swindon Town FC in the English League Cup on 24 September to set up a last-16 meeting with Arsenal FC.
- Van Ginkel is expected to be out until March after undergoing anterior cruciate ligament surgery following an injury sustained against Swindon.
- Mourinho is unbeaten at Stamford Bridge in 63 Premier League fixtures.
- Frank Lampard became the eighth England player to win 100 caps in September in a 0-0 draw in Ukraine. Michael Essien made his first appearance for Ghana since January 2010 against Zambia on 6 September.

Head coach

FC Steaua București: Laurențiu Reghecampf

Date of birth: 19 September 1975

Nationality: Romanian

Playing career: Chindia Târgoviște, FC Steaua București, PFC Litex Lovech (loan), FC Energie Cottbus, Alemannia Aachen, 1. FC Kaiserslautern

Coaching career: FC Snagov (twice), FC Universitatea Craiova (twice), ACF Gloria 1922 Bistrița, CS Concordia Chiajna, FC Steaua București

- A right-back who could also play in midfield, Reghecampf started his career at hometown club Târgoviște before joining Steaua in 1996 aged 21. Stayed four years and won two league titles, one Romanian Cup and one Super Cup, adding a Bulgarian league title during a six-month loan at Litex in 1998/99.
- Moved to Germany in 2000 and spent four years with both Cottbus and Aachen, where he was captain – influencing his mentality, approach and later work as a coach. Hung up his boots in 2009 following a season with Kaiserslautern and returned home to start his managerial career with second division Snagov.
- Moved on to Universitatea Craiova for the second half of 2009/10, helping the club avoid relegation; short spells at Gloria Bistrița and back at both Snagov and Universitatea Craiova followed.
- Took charge of Concordia Chiajna in December 2011 and lifted the club from 17th position to tenth, collecting 34 points from a possible 48 in the second half of the campaign – which won him a return to Steaua 12 years after he had left the club.
- In his first season back led Steaua to a first league title in seven years and the Romanian Super Cup; guided the club into the UEFA Europa League round of 16 and took them into the UEFA Champions League group stage at the start of 2013/14.

Chelsea FC: José Mourinho

Date of birth: 26 January 1963

Nationality: Portuguese

Coaching career: SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC (twice), FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after arriving at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007 but left the club that September.
- Joined Inter in June 2008 and in his first campaign retained the Scudetto, a feat the Nerazzurri repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League title, their first European crown since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before he joined Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and his second brought the Liga title; also led Madrid to three successive UEFA Champions League semi-finals, equalling Sir Alex Ferguson's record of seven last-four appearances, before returning to Chelsea at the start of June 2013.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oțelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
