Considering they are among our oldest opponents—they first came to Chelsea in the League on October 12, 1907—it is remarkable that we have never previously met here in the F.A. Cup. But, of course, Bolton have already crossed our Wembley path once this season. In the fourth round of the League Cup they jolted us by playing a 1-1 draw in October. Everything went right for us in the replay, but today is another day . . . Bolton will believe that what they have achieved once here this season they can do again . . . and even when we have been beaten only once in 22 matches, this is no time for anyone in our camp to feel the slightest bit complacent. Not, we fancy, that anyone does, but the reminder can do no harm.
